The groups get to know each other during four evenings in the winter and spring. In the past few years, the teachers at Hillel have incorporated the JARC experience into the 7th grade curriculum.

This past June, **George Rogers Victor**, son of Kelly and David Victor, graduated from Hillel Day School and included the importance of his JARC experience in his speech. "My teachers have not just talked about the values of, for instance, Jewish unity; they have created experiences for me to internalize it.



#### **Cooking Up Fun at JARC**

JARC has partnered with **Gleaner's Community Food Bank** to offer a special healthy cooking class for the people JARC serves.

Healthy eating habits, food budgeting, educational tours at grocery stores and basic cooking techniques will be the focus of the new Cooking Matters™ program, a groundbreaking nutrition-education program developed by the anti-hunger nonprofit Share Our Strength.

Cooking Matters™ is administered locally by Gleaners
Community Food Bank and teaches families at risk of hunger
how to get more food for their money and better nutrition from
those foods. Over the course of six weeks, participants learn
how to select nutritious and low-cost ingredients and prepare
them in delicious and healthy ways.

"We hope this new class provides the folks we serve in our Independent Living Program with the tools and knowledge to prepare healthy and budget-friendly meals," said **Kristi Davis, Recreation Manager for JARC**. "We want to empower them to be more confident when shopping for food and preparing meals. The Cooking Matters™ program is great because of the combination of experiential learning and nutritional and culinary education provided."

**JARC's Lynn Poldosky Culinary Arts Fund** will underwrite the grocery costs of the Cooking Matters™ program.





## 'FRESH FOOD TO THE DOOR' Program Delivers Healthy Foods to JARC Homes



The 'Fresh Food to the Door' program that **Yad Ezra**, JARC and **Gleaners Community Food Bank** started in 2011 is still going strong. It has been providing JARC with monthly food deliveries from Yad Ezra, supplemented with additional available fresh produce and other kosher foods from Gleaners at no cost to either JARC or Yad Ezra. Produce may include apples, carrots, onions, potatoes and other healthy Michigan-grown produce along with dry goods such as pasta.

On average, the monthly delivery includes almost 1,500 pounds of food and 200 pounds of toiletry items for 95 people living in ninteen JARC homes. The food and supplies are delivered to JARC's administrative office. JARC Board member **Lisa Pernick** volunteers each month to manage the distribution of the food to JARC's homes. JARC thanks Yad Ezra and Gleaners for their dedication to serving our community.
