Several of our JARC homes are getting new furniture with virtually indestructible upholstery - thanks to the generous donation of our Business Buddy – **Crypton**. Founded in 1993 by **Randy and Craig Rubin**, and based in Bloomfield Hills, Crypton is a global company that has successfully patented an upholstery fabric process that is impervious to stains, moisture, mildew and odors.

Through their generosity, the Rubins have donated over 200 yards of Crypton upholstery that is being used to cover new furniture as well as recover existing furniture.

"We are so proud to be able to do something for JARC," Randy Rubin states. "I have loved JARC since it started. It is an amazing cause. It always has been." Crypton fabric is available in a wide array of textures and colors. "It is very affordable," states Randy. "It is also the only fabric that has been deemed to be disinfectable by the EPA. JARC has in its homes the commercial version of Crypton, which is extremely heavy duty and easy to clean. "If there is a flu epidemic," she states, "you can disinfect the sofa!"

Sharon Alterman, Chair of the JARC Home Beautification Committee, says of Crypton and the Rubins, "They've been fabulous to work with, and are so helpful and eager to participate. The Crypton fabric is exactly what our homes need. Our furniture really gets a lot of daily use and sturdy fabric makes a tremendous difference. With so many beautiful colors and patterns of fabric available, it really brightens up the entire home. We can't thank them enough." From their modest beginning in the basement of the Rubin's home 24 years ago, Crypton has grown into a global company with a wide range of clients including Disney, the White House and even Buckingham Palace. The new furniture in our JARC homes is truly fit for a king...or queen! Thank you, Business Buddies Randy and Craig Rubin!

"It really warms my heart to see that people are served so well with JARC and really enjoying living life," added Jodi. "Bingo nights are such a great opportunity to get




to know JARC, interact with community members and see first-hand what JARC Heart means."
